Officer Reports

President

We have been busy completing the year-end book work: formulating a 2018 budget, closing a 2017-20 caretaker contract with Belden Property Services, obtaining building permits, scheduling the construction of the Club storage building, and planning other projects for 2018.

Vice President

Currently reviewing the 2017 books.

Treasurer

Marjie completed her first year as Treasurer and has finished the 2017 year-end reports as well as the <u>2018 budget</u>. These documents were sent to the Membership and posted to the Club <u>website</u>. The Board discussed the possibility of purchasing bookkeeping software, but decided the present system created by Mike Conway and refined by JC Bambach works well and is the most cost effective option. JC Bambach will review the 2017 books. The <u>2018 budget</u> includes the Club storage building and other capital improvements, some of which are detailed in the Buildings & Grounds report below. The assessment on the Club's new lot has been lowered, resulting in the taxes being lowered this year by \$617.

Secretary

Despite being very busy traveling for work, Karen has completed the <u>2017 General Membership Meeting Minutes</u> and has released these documents. They can be found on the Club <u>website</u>. Thanks, Karen!

General Board

Following up on completion/progress of Rizza, Hmelovsky, Dougherty, and Atiyeh's construction projects.

Committee Reports

Docks

Boat Slip Request Forms will be sent out in March. The <u>Boat Slip Request Form</u> can also be found on the Club website. In April, the Dock Crew will be checking why the main dock floats are taking on water and determining if this potential malfunction is covered under warranty. We are looking at the feasibility of using removable wheel kits for putting in/taking out main dock fingers. Fabrication of the Dockinator Mark II will begin at Mike Rizza's in New Paltz, New York.

Buildings & Grounds

Some of our primary projects for 2018 include: installing permanent goose fencing on the north beach, planting trees at the north beach and on the greens, beginning construction on the Club storage building approximately April 1st, upgrading drainage pipes on the Club triangle lot next to the Haynes' property.

Bylaws

We will be reviewing the Membership section of the Bylaws during the season. Voting on proposed changes will occur at the Fall 2018 meeting.

Rentals

We are considering adding the Town of Hague regulations to the Renter's Agreement document.

Nomination Committee

The Board needs to appoint a chairperson to the Nomination Committee. This person will assemble a committee and generate a slate of officer and member nominees for the 2018-2020 board.

Architectural

Reviewing the Graham/Mann's application for a fenced propane tank. Reviewing Rizza application for pergola over existing patio.

Entertainment

We are hoping to add some more events to the activities we hosted last year, which included: live music, 4th of July Picnic on the Point, Bagels on the Beach, and the first annual Jenkins Brook Rubber Duck Race. Please send your ideas to Carol Hodecker and/or Janet Aziz.
